This supplemental advice letter is submitted at the direction of the Division of Water and Audits in order to make minor corrections to Advice Letter 486-A, submitted on September 21, 2016, which seeks authorization to reflect in rates \$1,470,000 of San Gabriel's \$1,855,799 investment in the construction of a reservoir and site improvements at Plant G6. The proposed annual revenue increase is \$226,122 or 0.3%. An original and four copies of this advice letter are submitted in compliance with General Order 96-B. This is designated as a **Tier 2 Advice Letter**.

Background

On June 17, 2014, San Gabriel submitted Tier 2 Advice Letter 442 ("AL 442") proposing that rate base be increased by \$1,630,000 (capped), and that authorized revenues be increased by \$263,537 or 0.4%. The Office of Ratepayer Advocates ("ORA") protested, and by letter dated

June 24, 2014, the Division of Water and Audits rejected Advice Letter 442, citing: "without documentation showing that the recoating work for the existing reservoir was done, completed, and that the existing reservoir is now used and useful, and placed into service, Plant G6 is not a completed project. San Gabriel may choose to file a new advice letter for Plant G6 once it can demonstrate and document that the *entire* project has been completed and is used and useful and has been placed into service."

On February 6, 2015, following discussions with the Division of Water and Audits, San Gabriel submitted Tier 3 Advice Letter 456 ("AL 456") proposing that the rate base be increased by its full \$1,855,799 investment in the new Plant G6 reservoir. However, ORA again protested, and on November 5, 2015, the Commission did not adopt Proposed Resolution W-5063.

On December 31, 2015, as suggested by ORA, San Gabriel filed a petition for modification of D.11-11-018 in A.10-07-019 to change the scope of the Plant G6 project, eliminating the recoat of the existing reservoir, and on September 15, 2016, the Commission issued D.16-09-014 granting San Gabriel's motion. Ordering Paragraph No. 2 of that decision states:

San Gabriel Valley Water Company (San Gabriel) may file a Tier 2 advice letter consistent with the modification made in this decision to Decision 11-11-018. The Division of Water and Audits (DWA) will review the advice letter from San Gabriel for compliance with the modification to Decision 11-11-018. If the advice letter is consistent with today's decision, the Division of Water and Audits may approve it accordingly. If the anticipated advice letter is found to be not consistent with today's decision, then DWA must reject the [advice] letter and San Gabriel must file a new Tier 2 advice letter consistent with today's decision.

This advice letter requests authorization to reflect the revised capped amount of \$1,470,000 of San Gabriel's \$1,855,799 investment in rates.

Discussion

A. Reasonableness of Construction Expenditures

San Gabriel previously provided workpapers fully supporting its \$1,855,799 investment in the Plant G6 Project in both AL 422 and AL 456. Since those workpapers were not contested, San Gabriel does not provide them again with this advice letter.

B. Proposed Rate Design

San Gabriel's present rates in this division will become effective on September 20, 2016 through Advice Letter 484-A.

The revenue requirement calculation for this advice letter is almost identical to that provided with AL 422 with the single exception being the reduction of the proposed increase to Rate Base by Depreciation Reserve (because the Plant G6 Project became used and useful in May 2014).

Consistent with AL 422 and AL 456, in order to design rates, the following steps were performed: (1) calculate the incremental annual revenue requirement (i.e., Depreciation Expense, Ad Valorem Taxes, Income Taxes, and Return on Rate Base) using Commission-adopted quantities, and (2) increasing present rates proportionately by the calculated percentage increase in revenue requirement. It was determined that a revenue increase of \$226,122 or 0.3% is needed to support the depreciated \$1,470,000 investment. Accordingly, San Gabriel designed the proposed rates by increasing each component of its present base rates by 0.3%.

The proposed rates will cause the monthly bill of the typical residential customer under Schedule LA-1C, with a 5/8" x 3/4" meter and using 14 Ccf, to increase by \$0.18 or 0.3% from \$57.87 to \$58.05.

Supporting Workpapers

San Gabriel has furnished to the Commission staff for its review and verification, workpapers supporting the incremental revenue requirement and the proposed rate design.

Service and Notice

Distribution of this supplemental Advice Letter is being made to the attached service lists in accordance with Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order 96-B. San Gabriel will also post this Advice Letter on its website in accordance with Water Industry Rule 3.3. No further public notice is required because all public notices in connection with Application No. 10-07-019 have already been made in accordance with applicable law and Commission rules.

Protest and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A

protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) San Gabriel did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which San Gabriel relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a response or protest is:

2. The private fire service facilities shall be installed by the utility or under the utility's direction and shall be the sole property and subject to the control of the utility, with the right to alter, repair, replace and the right to remove upon discontinuance of service.
3. The minimum diameter for the private fire service connection will be 4 inches. The maximum diameter shall not be larger than the diameter of the water main to which the private fire service facilities are attached unless said main is circulating, in which case with the approval of the utility the maximum diameter may be larger by not more than 2 inches than the diameter of said circulating main.
4. If a water main of adequate size is not available adjacent to the premises to be served, then a new main from the nearest existing main of adequate size will be installed by the utility at the cost of the customer. Such cost shall not be subject to refund.
5. The private fire service facilities will include a detector check valve or other similar device acceptable to the utility which will indicate the use of water. The facilities may be located within the customer's premises or within public right of way adjacent thereto. Where located within the premises, the utility and its duly authorized agents shall have the right of ingress to and egress from the premises for all purposes related to said facilities. In the event the installation is solely a private fire hydrant facility, the requirement for a detector check valve or other similar device may be waived.

1. Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum account is to track the Quantity Rate revenues collected under Schedule LA-1C tiered rates against the revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate.
2. The following entries will be made monthly to the WRAM memorandum Account in the Los Angeles County division:
 - a. The recorded revenues collected through the tiered Quantity Rate under Schedule No. LA-1C (debit).
 - b. The calculated revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate for the same water usage as in 2a above (credit).
 - c. The CPUC-adopted Quantity Rates (\$/Ccf) to be used in calculating the revenues for 2a and 2b above are as follows:

- d. Franchise fees and uncollectible account expense, based on the net of 2a and 2b above, and the CPUC-adopted rates for franchise fees and uncollectible expenses.
 - e. Monthly interest calculated at 1/12 of the most recent month's interest rate on Commercial Paper (prime, 3-month), published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 (<http://www/federalreserve.gov/releases/H15/data/m/cp3m.txt>), or its successor publication.
3. The balance in the memorandum account shall be amortized by a Tier 1 advice letter whenever the balance exceeds 2% of the authorized revenue requirement for the preceding calendar year. If the balance is below 2%, San Gabriel shall propose its amortization in a general rate case.
4. The memorandum account will terminate when so ordered in a CPUC general rate case decision, at which time any remaining debit (undercollection) or credit (overcollection) balance will be amortized through a rate surcharge or surcredit.
