San Gabriel Valley Water Company ("San Gabriel") hereby requests ministerial review and approval of the following changes in tariff sheets applicable to its Los Angeles County division:

This **water supply cost offset** filing increases revenues in San Gabriel's Los Angeles County division by \$681,336 or 0.9% to offset increases in water supply costs and groundwater pumping assessments effective January 1, 2017. In accordance with Water Industry Rule 7.3.1(7) as modified by Resolution W-4664 and Water Industry Rule 8.4 of General Order 96-B, **this filing is designated Tier 1**. The attached tariff schedules shall take effect January 1, 2017 and rates will be increased by \$0.0477/Ccf.

Purpose and Background

The major portion of water supplies for San Gabriel's Los Angeles County division come from groundwater pumped from the Main San Gabriel Basin and to a lesser extent from groundwater pumped from the Central Basin. The Main San Gabriel Basin has increased its Water Resource Development Assessment from \$20/AF to

\$40/AF (part of the Watermaster Pumping Assessment on San Gabriel's Water Cost Summary). The Central Basin Municipal Water District increased its Monthly Meter Charge from \$69/cfs to \$81/cfs, its Recycled Water charge from \$556/AF to \$649/AF, and decreased its Watermaster Service Assessment from \$5,095.95 to \$4,707.37 per year. Finally, the San Gabriel Valley Water Association increased its assessment from \$0.70/AF to \$1.00/AF.

The water supply costs and assessments currently reflected in rates were adopted in Advice Letter 481 based on the adopted test year quantities set forth in Decision 11-11-018. The present rate schedules in this division became effective on October 3, 2016 as a result of Advice Letter 486-B.

The impact of these changes to water supply costs and pumping assessments increases the adopted expense from \$18,513,172 to \$19,187,198, and increases the previously adopted Advice Letter 486-B revenue requirement of \$73,220,447 by \$681,336 or 0.9% to \$73,901,783. The proposed rates submitted with this advice letter raise the monthly bill of the typical residential customer on Schedule No. LA-1 with a 5/8" x 3/4" meter using 14 Ccf by \$0.67 or 1.0% from \$65.70 to \$66.37 and customers on Schedule No. LA-1C by \$0.68 or 1.1% from \$63.82 to \$64.49. San Gabriel has furnished the Commission's Water Division staff with two copies of workpapers providing detailed support for the proposed increase.

The matters addressed in this advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

Notice of Rate Increase

In accordance with Water Industry Rule 3.2 of General Order 96-B, as modified by Commission Resolution W-4664, San Gabriel will inform its customers of the increase by bill insert (a draft of which is provided with the workpapers) in the first bill that includes the increased rates. No other parties have requested notification of tariff filings related to the Los Angeles County division.

In accordance with Water Industry Rule 3.3 of General Order 96-B, San Gabriel will also post this advice letter to its website www.sgvwater.com. Finally, distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order No. 96-B.

Protest and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) San Gabriel did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which San Gabriel relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Division of Water and Audits within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

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after the end of the protest period, and shall be served on the same day to the person who filed the protest or response.

H1. Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) Memorandum Account for the Los Angeles County Division

1. Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum account is to track the Quantity Rate revenues collected under Schedule LA-1C tiered rates against the revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate.
2. The following entries will be made monthly to the WRAM memorandum Account in the Los Angeles County division:
 - a. The recorded revenues collected through the tiered Quantity Rate under Schedule No. LA-1C (debit).
 - b. The calculated revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate for the same water usage as in 2a above (credit).
 - c. The CPUC-adopted Quantity Rates (\$/Ccf) to be used in calculating the revenues for 2a and 2b above are as follows:

- d. Franchise fees and uncollectible account expense, based on the net of 2a and 2b above, and the CPUC-adopted rates for franchise fees and uncollectible expenses.
- e. Monthly interest calculated at 1/12 of the most recent month's interest rate on Commercial Paper (prime, 3-month), published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 (<http://www.federalreserve.gov/releases/H15/data/m/cp3m.txt>), or its successor publication.
3. The balance in the memorandum account shall be amortized by a Tier 1 advice letter whenever the balance exceeds 2% of the authorized revenue requirement for the preceding calendar year. If the balance is below 2%, San Gabriel shall propose its amortization in a general rate case.
4. The memorandum account will terminate when so ordered in a CPUC general rate case decision, at which time any remaining debit (undercollection) or credit (overcollection) balance will be amortized through a rate surcharge or surcredit.
