TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

In compliance with Ordering Paragraph No. 3 of Resolution M-4819, dated June 7, 2007, San Gabriel Valley Water Company ("San Gabriel") hereby submits for filing the following changes in tariff sheets applicable to its Los Angeles County and Fontana Water Company divisions:

Background and Purpose

Section 431 of the Public Utilities Code states: "The Commission shall annually determine a fee to be paid by every electrical, gas, telephone, telegraph, water, sewer system, and heat corporation and every other public utility providing service directly to customers and subscribers and subject to the jurisdiction of the Commission other than a railroad, except as provided in Article 2 (commencing with Section 421)."

On June 7, 2007, the Commission approved Resolution M-4819 setting the PUC Utilities Reimbursement Account Fee (PUCURAF) level for fiscal year 2007-2008 at 1.5% of revenue for Water Corporations. The current fee is 1.4% of revenue. The purpose of this advice letter, therefore, is to revise tariff Schedule No. AA-UF, Surcharge to Fund Public Utilities Commission, to reflect the updated fee of 1.5% of revenue. No cost information is required for this filing.

Effective Date

To comply with Ordering Paragraph No. 3 in Resolution M-4819, San Gabriel requests an effective date of July 1, 2007, for the revised tariff schedules herein.

Protest and Responses

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) The utility did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which the utility relies;
- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding; or
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory (provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.)

A protest shall provide citations or proofs where available to allow staff to properly consider the protest.

A response or protest must be made in writing or by electronic mail and must be received by the Water Division within 20 days of the date this advice letter is filed. The address for mailing or delivering a protest is:

If you have not received a reply to your protest within 10 business days, contact this person at 626-448-6183.

Cities and counties that need Board of Supervisors or Board of Commissioners approval to protest should inform the Water Division, within the 20 day protest period, so that a late filed protest can be entertained. The informing document should include an estimate of the date the proposed protest might be voted on.

The actions requested in the advice letter are not now the subject of any formal filings with the California Public Utilities Commission, including a formal complaint, nor action in any court of law.

No individuals or utilities have requested notification of filing of tariffs. Distribution of this advice letter is being made to the attached service list in accordance with General Order No. 96, Section III-G.
