## TO THE PUBLIC UTILITIES COMMISSION OF THE STATE OF CALIFORNIA

San Gabriel Valley Water Company ("San Gabriel") hereby requests the following changes in tariff sheets applicable to its Fontana Water Company division:

The purpose of this advice letter is to reduce rate base (and rates) to reflect the collection and application of the amount of Facilities Fees recorded in the Facilities Fees Memorandum Account which reserves the estimated remaining cost to complete the Fontana Recycled Water Project. An original and four copies of this advice letter are submitted to reflect in rates Facilities Fees and memorandum account interest recorded since June 2016, and to decrease the adopted annual revenue requirement by \$730,860 or 1.0% effective immediately. The proposed rate reduction will cause the monthly bill of the typical non-CARW residential customer on conservation rate Schedule No. FO-1C to decrease by \$0.83 or 1.0% from \$81.59 to \$80.76. This advice letter proposing a rate reduction is designated as Tier 1.

### **Discussion**

San Gabriel last adjusted rates to reflect Facilities Fees and interest recorded in the Facilities Fees Memorandum Account through June 2016 (\$6,861,393) by Advice Letter No. 485, effective August 30, 2016. This advice letter proposes to adjust rates to reflect the balance in the Facilities Fees Memorandum Account as of June 2017.

When San Gabriel collects deposits of Facilities Fees from developers, it credits Account 30-242-85. When the related construction jobs are either completed or abandoned, San Gabriel removes the deposited amount from this account. For completed jobs, the deposit is transferred to Account 30-242-86. Monthly net changes recorded in these two accounts are included in the Facilities Fees Memorandum Account, with the following two adjustments:

First, when San Gabriel applies Facilities Fees to a completed project, it transfers that amount from Account 30-242-86 to Account 30-242, Contributions in Aid of Construction (CIAC). Since rates are not simultaneously adjusted when this accounting transfer takes place, San Gabriel retains these transferred amounts in the memorandum account until the rates are adjusted, as it did in August 2016 with the \$6,861,393 approved in Advice Letter No. 485.

Second, D.12-06-002 in A.11-06-005 authorized the use of Facilities Fees to fund a new recycled water project. Ordering Paragraph No. 3 states:

3. San Gabriel Valley Water Company shall offset all Project Costs and any accrued capitalized interest costs recorded in the Project Work Order by (a) the amount of facilities fees received pursuant to Fontana Water Company Tariff Schedule No. FO-FF, CPUC Sheet Nos. 1875W and 1876W and (b) any available grants or contributions received from other sources for the local recycled water distribution system project, until all the Project costs and any accrued capitalized interest costs have been offset and reimbursed.

The Settlement Agreement approved in D.12-06-002 provided that no recycled water Project Costs will ever be included in San Gabriel's rate base or otherwise be included in San Gabriel's revenue requirement for ratemaking purposes. Accordingly, the subject recycled water project was designated by the Commission as first in line to be offset by Facilities Fees on a going-forward basis, and the capital expenditures to construct the recycled water project have never been reflected in rate base. Because the recycled water project is not permitted to be reflected in rate base, San Gabriel continues to record the capital costs of this project in the Facilities

Fees Memorandum Account as an offset to compute the amount of Facilities Fees (plus interest) that are available for application to other projects.

The purpose of this advice letter is to reflect in rates the amount of collected Facilities Fees (plus interest) recorded in the Facilities Fees Memorandum Account through June 2017, which exceed the estimated amount still to be applied to the Recycled Water Project pending completion.

The currently adopted rates became effective on September 15, 2017 through Advice Letter 503. The proposed decrease in the previously adopted base rate revenues is \$730,860 or 1.0% from \$71,107,600 to \$70,376,740. The proposed rates were designed by proportionately reducing the present rates by 1.0%.

### **Supporting Workpapers**

San Gabriel has furnished to the Commission staff for its review and verification, workpapers supporting the proposed revenue requirement and rate design.

### **Notice of Rate Change**

In accordance with the requirements of Water Industry Rule 4.1 of General Order No. 96-B, this advice letter is being sent to the parties listed on the attached distribution list. No other parties have requested notification of tariff filings related to the Fontana Water Company division. ### **Protest and Responses**

Anyone may respond to or protest this advice letter. A response supports the filing and may contain information that proves useful to the Commission in evaluating the advice letter. A protest objects to the advice letter in whole or in part and must set forth the specific grounds on which it is based. These grounds are:

- (1) San Gabriel did not properly serve or give notice of the advice letter;
- (2) The relief requested in the advice letter would violate statute or Commission order, or is not authorized by statute or Commission order on which San Gabriel relies;

- (3) The analysis, calculations, or data in the advice letter contain material error or omissions;
- (4) The relief requested in the advice letter is pending before the Commission in a formal proceeding;
- (5) The relief requested in the advice letter requires consideration in a formal hearing, or is otherwise inappropriate for the advice letter process; or
- (6) The relief requested in the advice letter is unjust, unreasonable, or discriminatory, provided that such a protest may not be made where it would require relitigating a prior order of the Commission.

**SPECIAL CONDITIONS**

1. The customer will pay, without refund, the entire cost of the private fire service facilities.
2. The private fire service facilities shall be installed by the utility or under the utility's direction and shall be the sole property and subject to the control of the utility, with the right to alter, repair, replace and the right to remove upon discontinuance of service.
3. The minimum diameter for the private fire service connection will be 4-inches. The maximum diameter shall not be larger than the diameter of the water main to which the private fire service facilities are attached unless said main is circulating, in which case with the approval of the utility the maximum diameter may be larger by not more than 2-inches than the diameter of said circulating main.
4. If a water main of adequate size is not available adjacent to the premises to be served, then a new main from the nearest existing main of adequate size will be installed by the utility at the cost of the customer. Such cost shall not be subject to refund.
5. The private fire service facilities will include a detector check valve or other similar device acceptable to the utility which will indicate the use of water. The facilities may be located within the customer's premises or within public right of way adjacent thereto. Where located within the premises, the utility and its duly authorized agents shall have the right of ingress to and egress from the premises for all purposes related to said facilities. In the event the installation is solely a private fire hydrant facility, the requirement for a detector check valve or other similar device may be waived.

The Service Charge is a readiness-to-serve charge which is applicable to all metered service and to which is added the charge for reclaimed water used computed at the Quantity Rates.

**SPECIAL CONDITIONS**

1. The Quantity Rate is set at 75% of the Quantity Rate of Schedule No. FO-1.
2. The customer is responsible for compliance with all local, state, and federal rules and regulations that apply to the use of recycled water on the customer's premises.
3. The utility will supply only such recycled water at such pressure as may be available from time to time from the recycled water system. The customer shall indemnify the utility and save it harmless against any and all claims arising out of service under this schedule and shall further agree to make no claims against the utility for any loss or damage resulting from service under this schedule.
4. All bills are subject to the reimbursement fee set forth on Schedule No. AA-UF.

**H2. Water Revenue Adjustment Mechanism (WRAM) Memorandum Account for the Fontana Water Company Division**

1. Purpose: The purpose of this memorandum account is to track the Quantity Rate revenues collected under Schedule FO-1C tiered rates against the revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate.
2. The following entries will be made monthly to the WRAM memorandum Account in the Fontana Water Company division:
  - a. The recorded revenues collected through the tiered Quantity Rate under Schedule No. FO-1C (debit).
  - b. The calculated revenues that would have been collected under a single block Quantity Rate for the same water usage as in 2a above (credit).
  - c. The CPUC-adopted Quantity Rates (\$/Ccf) to be used in calculating the revenues for 2a and 2b above are as follows:

- d. Franchise fees and uncollectible account expense, based on the net of 2a and 2b above, and the CPUC-adopted rates for franchise fees and uncollectible expenses.
- e. Monthly interest calculated at 1/12 of the most recent month's interest rate on Commercial Paper (prime, 3-month), published in the Federal Reserve Statistical Release, H.15 (<http://www.federalreserve.gov/releases/H15/data/m/cp3m.txt>), or its successor publication.
3. The balance in the memorandum account shall be amortized by a Tier 1 advice letter whenever the balance exceeds 2% of the authorized revenue requirement for the preceding calendar year. If the balance is below 2%, San Gabriel shall propose its amortization in a general rate case.
4. The memorandum account will terminate when so ordered in a CPUC general rate case decision, at which time any remaining debit (undercollection) or credit (overcollection) balance will be amortized through a rate surcharge or surcredit.
